Press Release Tourism Promotion Program in Pattaya

With the slogan of 'Nepal is Beautiful: Visit & Enjoy in Nepal' the Embassy of Nepal in Bangkok organized a tourism promotion program at hotel Holiday Inn in Pattaya on 01 July 2016. More than 100 representatives from outbound Travel and Tour Operators, media houses, and representatives from Thai Government attended the program.

Mr. Bundit Sirithunyhong, Chairman of Thai-ASEAN Cultural and Economic Council, delivered his impressive remarks on tourism attractions and potentialities of Nepal.

In addition to the presentation of video on Lumbini, tourism promotion materials like framed photos of Maya Devi Temple of Lumbini, Mt. Everest, Boudha Stupa, and Mt. Fishtail along with posters of Mt. Everest and those of Maya Devi Temple of Lumbini, and CD/DVD and brochures on Major tourism attractions prepared by Nepal Tourism Boards were distributed to all guests. High resolution photos of Mt. Everest, Mya Devi Temple of Lumbini, Baudha Stupa, Kanyam Tea Estate etc. framed in larger size were displayed on the space of the hallway just outside the program hall.
